1974 FAMILY RIGHTS TO PRIVACY ACT INFORMATION

This act insures confidentiality of your educational record and access by third parties, except as authorized by law. You and your parents if they are supporting your education have the right to inspect your educational records, with certain exceptions. If you believe these records are inaccurate you may request correction and, if denied, have the right to a hearing and to place a letter of rebuttal in your file if the outcome of that hearing is negative.

Boston University's policies and procedures for implementation of this Act are enumerated in the Compliance Manual, available at the Dean's Office of each school and college and at the Access Office, 881 Commonwealth Avenue, 2nd floor, Boston, MA 02215.

The University does not release information about your home address, telephone number, or your parents except as authorized by law. On the other hand, your attendance, name, college, study year, and date of expected graduation are considered information in the public domain that can be released.

Under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, Boston University students are entitled to have access to letters of evaluation contained in their permanent educational records at Boston University. However, an applicant may waive this right of access, please indicate such by signing your name on the line below the following statement:

I WAIVE MY RIGHT OF ACCESS to the contents of my folder and ask that Boston University hold it in confidence so that it is available only to the University and to the professional schools to which I apply.
